[Link](#): Localized origin of the name Originally "Waldo" was a playful substitute for one of the most common misspelled words in the American English language: "waddled", meaning "walked". For more than three decades, Waldo has been the name of the title character in a series of children's books, most famously the iconic *Where's Waldo* series by author Martin Handford. The character, Waldo the Walrus, is an overly animated walrus who has a penchant for hiding in unlikely places. The name "Waldo" is derived from the name of a wildlife character featured in one of the earliest video games called "Borak", created in the 1960s by Frank Sinatra, Jr. The name "Waldo" is a shortened form of the name *Wolfdietrich*, a Germanic warlord from a legendary Germanic tribe of vikings who lived in the area of modern-day Switzerland who was said to have "roamed the countryside with a wolfpack"; however, the name "Wolfdietrich" cannot be traced to the same person or clan as the name "Waldo". The name "Waldo" also makes a reference to the name of the television personality Walter Cronkite, who was also known for his playful use of absurdity and off-color jokes.
